Daily Tour to Meteora UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE SITE







Meteora literally means "suspended in mid air", which is probably the best way to describe this sublime merging of geological drama and religious spirituality. The amazingly imposing rocks of Meteora were formed about 60 million years ago and evidence dates human presence there as far back as 50,000 years. Christian hermitage probably started around the 12th Century, but it was not until the 14th Century that these precariously perched monasteries began to emerge. By this time, older forms of one-man ascetic hermitages had given way to more organized groups of monks, who formed orders and proceeded with the seemingly impossible task of constructing buildings on these steep and inaccessible peaks. Typically, each monastery would comprise of a church, cloistered living quarters or cells, a refectory, a library and in some cases, a treasury. For many centuries, travelers and monks had to be hauled up to these remote sanctuaries in a basket or net at the end of a rope. Of the six monasteries still active today, Great Meteoron and Varlaam are the two largest and most visited.



Great Meteoron






It is probably the earliest monastery in Meteora founded by the Athonite monk Athanasios around 1356. The main church or catholicon is dedicated to the Transfiguration and has a typical 14th Century edifice with some later additions, while the apse carries a pattern strongly reminiscent of Mt. Athos. The interior of the church is painted in a Byzantine manner, with many scenes from the life of Jesus, and there is a delightfully elaborate wood carved iconostases. Around the catholicon there are several monastic buildings, such as a 16th Century double domed refectory, a fifty cell cloister, a library and two chapels.




Moni Varlaam

Situated in an adjacent summit to the Great Meteoron, it was founded in the 16th Century by the brothers Nektarios and Theophanis Apsarades of Ioannina. It is actually built on the site of a 14th Century hermitage that was occupied by the apocryphal Varlaam, a saint whose legendary life somehow resembles that of the Buddha. The All Saints catholicon is decorated with remarkable 16th Century frescoes and there is a particularly splendid depiction of the Last Judgment. There are also several other well preserved monastic buildings, as well as a library and a well appointed guest house.

IN THE STEPS OF THESPROTIAS' SAINTS







An area with strong christian orthodox element, Thesprotia is the crossroad of many saints who lived and acted in the area since the 4th A.D. century. In just 23 km from the city of Igoumenitsa is situated the Monastery of Giromeri that was founded in the beginning of the 14th century. It is adorned with excellent Byzantine murals, unique in all over Epirus for their artistic influences and peculiarities. Many artefacts are preserved like icons, manuscripts, old-typed books, mass vessels and vestments.

On the way down you can visit Foiniki, a small traditional village built on the 15th century and enjoy the amazingly beautiful old stownhouses with the arched gates. A full operative folklore museum with a lot of objects of the past is worth the visit.

A small break by the sea is next on schedule, in the fisherman's village of Sagiada, where you can taste fresh quality fishes and especially sea bass.

On the way back to the ship, we have a last stop at the Holy Monastery of Ragio, dedicated to the Virgin's Assumption. Founded during the Byzantine Empire this small monastery still preserves parts of the auxiliary rooms as well as part of the cells.

Moving south from Igoumenitsa along the coastal road with views of fjord like coves, turquoise blue waters and lush Mediterranean countryside, it soon becomes evident that the drive to Syvota is a perfect opportunity to experience the singular beauty of the Thesprotian headland. As for the destination itself, this small seaside town with its pretty waterfront seems the perfect stop for a glimpse at the laid back lifestyle of Ionian yachting. You can rent a small private boat and visit the surrounding islands of Syvota with the numerous private beaches and turquoise blue waters. Swim in Pisina beach, one of the most beautiful beaches in Greece and walk to Mourtemeno island through a small earth line in the sea. Or you can enjoy your swim in pristine beaches like Mega Ammos and Karvouno, where a variety of water sports like windsurfing, snorkeling, water skiing as well as canoeing and sailing are available. Finish the tour with coffee, lunch and a casual walk in the village of Syvota where you can enjoy fresh fish as well as greek traditional cuisine and buy your souvenirs and gifts.

Excursion to Souli Paramythia

Duration: 6 hours

A journey into the history, an exploration in the hinterland of Epirus, where the mountains of Paramythia, delimit and shape a daily life that is pure and at the same time decisive. We travel to Paramythia, Thesprotia and visit the historic church of "Panagia Paramythia" which was built in the 14th century, hosting relics of inestimable value. We visit the Byzantine Baths, which stand out for their rarity and date back to the mid-Byzantine period. The excursion continues to the Primary School which was built in 1937, with the significant sponsorship of the Voulgari family, owner of the famous brand Bylgari.





As part of the tour of the settlement, you will admire the Riga Mansion, which contains architectural elements of Epirus in combination with European, the covered Public Market which operates every Saturday, but also the first store of the family of brand Bylgari. The Riga house, the famous alleys of the settlement, but also a stop for coffee on the sidewalk and markets of local products, will complete the visit to Paramythia. This is followed by a visit to the Acheron River, walking or participating in alternative activities such as canoeing, rafting and horseback riding. The traditional restaurants by the river, serve delicious local recipes that you can enjoy, experiencing the essence of the Eprius hospitality.

Daily Tour to loannina





Morning departure for the area of ancient Dodoni, we will be guided to the archeological site which was a place of worship for him and Dioni and is also known for the ancient oracle of Greek culture with the sacred fig, which was visited by Odysseus to get an oracle for his return to Ithaca. We will admire the ancient theater of Dodoni, of the 3rd century BC, which was built by Pyrrhus, king of Epirus, one of the best and largest surviving Greek theaters from Ioannina and dates back to 1,500,000 years.

It was accidentally discovered in 1940 by the inhabitants of the area. Next destination is the castle of loannina and The Museum of Silversmithing. We continue to the pier where we will take the boat and in a few minutes we will disembark on the island, which is located on Lake Pamvotida. was assassinated in January 1822 by Khurshid Pasha's army. Free time for coffee, food and shopping either in the castle or in the city of loannina.






After breakfast we departure for the picturesque Zagorochoria. Our first destination is village Monodendri, the special homeland of the national benefactors of Manthos and George Rizaris, as well as the founder of pediatrics in Greece, Anastasios Zinnis.

First we will visit the church of Agia Paraskevi of 1412, built on the edge of the gorge of Vikos and then we will admire the Rizareio handicraft area with the beautiful embroidery, creations of the schoolgirls from traditional looms. Continuing our route we will visit Oxia where we will have the opportunity to enjoy the panoramic view of the gorge. Then on our way we will stop to admire the much photographed bridge of Kokoris. Next destination is the village of Kipoi. Free time for food and walks in the village.















Daily Tour to Metsovo

Duration: 6 hours





We leave in the morning for the artificial lake of Aoos springs. It is located in a beautiful location just 25 minutes from Metsovo and at an altitude of 1350 meters. We continue to Metsovo where we will have the opportunity to visit the most important sights of the village (Tositsa Folklore Museum, Averof Gallery, Katogi Averof Winery)

The area is particularly known for its cheese products, spearheaded by the rise of local Metsovone cheese in the Fifties as well as its eclectic wines from Greece's highest vineyards that make wine-tasting in the region a must for visitors. Don't forget to make a wine-tasting reservation at the Katogi Averoff Hotel & Winery. A unique opportunity is given to taste different labels, starting with the popular Katogi Averoff and moving towards the new range of wines, known as lnima, which means "'soul" in the local Vlach dialect. Apart from the wine tasting, there are video projections that explain the history of the winery that also operates a wine bar and an exceptional boutique with products and accessories for wine as well as a range of local delicacies, books on wine and winemaking.
